**What are the “state-only” competitive events?**

**The goal of this document is to:**

1. What are the competitive events that will be offered at the RLC?
2. What are the state-only events?
3. How many students may I enter in an event at my RLC?
4. What events have grade-level specific restrictions?

The following information will answer multiple questions at a time. Remember, there will be a series of documents that will answer these questions. This document will focus on “state-only” competitive events at your RLC. The following events are open to students in grades 9-12. There may be some specific restrictions attached to these events.

**It is important to remember that state-only events must be received by the Executive Director’s office no later than December 5, 2016, no later than 11:59 pm. They events are not offered at your RLC; however, if a student enters one of these events, he/she may not compete in the individual or team events at your RLC.**

If there is a discrepancy between what I have written here and the PA FBLA Policy/Leadership Handbook, anything that is written in the PA FBLA Policy/Leadership Handbook supersedes anything I have written.

## **3D Animation**

You can design your FEC as you wish, but it must be completely indoors and include an arcade and food. You will also be offering party packages to your customers. You will need to name your FEC, create the theme, and design the floor plan for needed construction/renovation. You will need to purchase equipment, furnishings, and inventory for your decided launch date. You will need to determine hours of operation, decide staffing requirements, and create marketing and advertising plans.

- \* Generate/print weekly schedule reports
- \* Enter attendance of customers
- \* Enter/track, generate, and print report(s) showing customer attendance by time of day (AM/PM) and day of week

- \* Be a standalone executable program
- \* Be virus and malware free
- \* Contain a celebratory event and conclusion
- \* Leaderboard
- \* Audio and visual indicator that the game has been completed
- \* Run solely by a keyboard stroke
- \* Qualify for maximum ESRB rating of E10+

Clarification from the National Office (published 8/15/16): There appears to be some confusion about what "new, member" means in the 2017 NLC topics for Digital Video Production, Publication Design, and Social Media Campaign. A "member" original TV series or movie refers to something like Fuller House on Netflix or a movie that HBO produces and airs. Those networks are called member networks because you have to subscribe to them. "New" refers to the fact that it needs to be a new TV series or movie, where the FBLA students come up with the concept, title, logo, etc.
