
Eligibility Guidelines

Repeat Competitors

Members may not repeat an event at the SLC. Exceptions to this regulation are as follows:

- *Modified Events.* An individual may compete in the same event when the event is modified.
- *Team Events.* In the case of an entry submitted by a team, rather than an individual, one member of the team may have been involved in an entry submitted at one previous SLC to include 3D Animation, Banking & Financial Systems, Broadcast Journalism, Business Ethics, Business Financial Plan, Business Plan, Computer Game & Simulation Programming, Digital Video Production, E-business, Emerging Business Issues, Entrepreneurship, Global Business, Graphic Design, Hospitality Management, Introduction to Business Presentation, Management Decision Making, Management Information Systems, Marketing, Mobile Application Development, Network Design, Public Service Announcement, Publication Design, Social Media Campaign, Sports & Entertainment Management, and Web Site Design. Team members may not compete in the same event for more than two (2) years.
- *Parliamentary Procedure.* Two members of the team may have competed in the event at a previous SLC; however, they may not compete in the same event more than two (2) years at the SLC.
- *Individual Entry.* A member who has competed as an individual in an individual/team event (1-3) may compete again in the same event as a team member the following year, not as an individual.
- *Pilot Events.* Participation in a pilot event does not disqualify a member competing in the same event once it becomes an official competition. A person participating in a pilot event is not eligible to compete in another individual or team event.

Sequenced Events

The following events are considered to be linked in a series. Once a member has competed at the SLC in the second or advanced event in the series, he/she may not subsequently compete in the first or introductory event. Event series impacted by this regulation include:

- Accounting I and Accounting II
- Introduction to Financial Math and Business Calculations
- Introduction to Business Communication and Business Communication
- Introduction to Parliamentary Procedure and Parliamentary Procedure
- Introduction to Public Speaking and Public Speaking

9th and 10th Grade Events

- Introduction to Business
- Introduction to Business Communication
- Introduction to Business Presentation
