Prior Year PA FBLA Accomplishments

As we start 2017-2018, let's reflect on some of PA FBLA accomplishments this past year:

- 1. We are the third largest state chapter in the national organization with 294 active chapters and 13,608 members (our highest membership ever in our history)—third only to Georgia and Missouri.
- 2. We had our largest delegation ever attend the NLC in Anaheim, California, with more than 612 travelers on the PA FBLA travel package. When you add in those who traveled on their own, that number reaches between 650-675 who traveled across the country to represent PA FBLA.
- 3. We had the third highest number of award winners at the 2017 NLC—third only to California and Georgia.
- 4. Our State Leadership Conference attendance was more than 4,500 attendees, which is one of the largest state conferences in the national association.
- $5. \ \ We\ raised\ \$71{,}000\ for\ the\ 2016-2017\ State\ Project,\ the\ National\ Kidney\ Foundation.$
- 6. Our middle-level program continues to grow, and we offered an expanded program of events to reach as many ML students as possible. We

reached 717 middle-level members in 25 active chapters, our largest membership ever.

- 7. Our Virtual Chapter Membership continues to grow with more students participating in the program than ever before—giving options to students who are not in a traditional brick-and-mortar schools or who are in schools where no FBLA chapter exists.
- 8. One of our largest and most successful State Leadership Workshops in our history was held this past November. Our State Leadership Workshop moves to the nationally recognized Kalahari Resorts in the Pocono Mountains this year. More information about the SLW can be found on the main page of the web site.

Membership Processing

If you have been checking the PA FBLA web site, you saw that membership processing opened on August 1. Here's the step-by-step membership processing instructions in case you need a refresher: Membership Processing Instructions.

If you do not remember your username and password, please contact me; however, you will receive a reminder email from me with that information this week.

Here are some reminders about membership processing:

- 1. <u>Dues are not refundable</u>, nor is membership transferable from one student to another student. Once you enter a student's name into the system, it is our policy that the student is an FBLA member and you are now responsible for the dues payment. Please DO NOT enter a student's name into the membership system unless you are certain the student will pay dues. Please do not ask to replace one student's name with another name because a student has chosen to go inactive or to not participate.
- 2. Please make sure you have the correct spelling for the student's name. Once you enter the name into the system, any edits must be made by the state office.
- 3. Dues are still \$12 total -- \$6 state and \$6 national for students in Grades 9-12. For middle-level members, dues are \$3 state and \$6 national for students in Grades 5-8.
- 4. All membership processing is done through the Pennsylvania FBLA web site. Please do not process your membership through the national web site.
- 5. All dues are paid to PA FBLA, not the national office.

National Chapter Management Handbook

The national handbook will be online this year, and you will not receive any printed copies/updates of the handbook; you should go to: **go.fbla.org/CMH** OR http://www.fbla-pbl.org/fbla/chapter-management-handbook/.

Not all components of the handbook have been published, but it should be very soon when the entire handbook is available. Until we see that handbook, we are not able to update our PA FBLA handbook.

Members at large ARE NOT automatically granted attendance at the SLC.

Chapters are only eligible for the members at large IE they submit an online application to Kristi Ryland, PA FBLA State Adviser, no later than

January 19, 2018.

Priority seating at the State Leadership Conference Awards Program is made by region's total membership increase % -- from highest to lowest. Those regions with the largest % increase are seated first with all other placed in numerical sequence from highest % to lowest % increase or decrease.

There will be assigned seating at both the Opening and Closing Sessions of the State Leadership Conference.

We will be implementing a new State Leadership Conference payment schedule and deadline schedule. This is the procedure we will follow:

Online Registration and Online Lodging Must Completed by: January 20, 2018

SLC Registration Payment Must Be Postmarked by: January 20, 2018 SLC Lodging Payment Must be Postmarked by: January 31, 2018

The January 20 and January 31 dates will now become standard dues dates/payment postmark deadline dates.

SLC Payment Options Accepted:

- 1. School Check
- 2. Personal check from parents/advisers
- 3. School Purchase Orders (all payments must be postmarked in full no later than 30 days prior to the opening of the SLC, which is March 9, 2018)
- 4. School Credit Card (3% convenience fee applies)
- 5. Personal Credit Card (3% convenience fee applies)
- 6. Payment Schedule/Agreement with FBLA Chapter and PA FBLA Executive Director's Office Completed Prior to the January 20, 2018, deadline. This option will help those chapters that may need to complete fundraising to attend the SLC.

SLC Conference Registration: There will a 3-tier registration fee schedule starting with the 2018 SLC.

- 1. Early-bird Registration Fee: \$85 per person (includes advisers, members, guests) IF payment is postmarked by January 20, 2018.
- 2. Regular Registration Fee: \$110 per person (includes advisers, members, guests) IF payment is postmarked between January 21, 2018, through March 20, 2018.

This \$110 fee does not apply if a payment option is made by January 20, 2018. Remember, you have all options to choose from including establishing a separate payment schedule for your chapter is fund raising needs to occur.

3. <u>Late Registration Fee</u>: \$135 per person (includes advisers, members, guests) IF payment is postmarked March 21, 2018, through the opening of the State Leadership Conference.

This \$135 fee does not apply if a payment option is made by January 20, 2018. Remember, you have all options to choose from including establishing a separate payment schedule for your chapter is fund raising needs to occur.

SLC Lodging Fees: The 2018 SLC lodging fees will be announced later this fall.

New at the SLC this year: All advisers and members attending the SLW must have a "data-enabled" device as we will be using an official PA FBLA SLW Program App rather than a printed program. Any paper copy we provided will be minimal; a full paper-based program should not be expected. WiFi will be free to all SLC attendees. Advisers will need to provide email addresses of all workshop attendees prior to the SLC so that we can email app download instructions prior to the SLC.

Clarification for you and your student: The national office uses the following statement as part of the application: "Email approval from your state and local chapter adviser. Forwarded emails or screenshots are fine." The national office uses the term "state adviser" indicating the primary state contact should provide approval. DO NOT email Kristi Ryland, PA FBLA State Adviser, for approval. All approvals must come from Bruce Boncal, PA FBLA Executive Director, who is the primary state contact and is the "state adviser" in the eyes of the national office.

Myths about the Outstanding Chapter Criteria:

- 1. The chapter must complete all items. FALSE
 - a. Chapters picks and choose what they want to complete.
- 2. All of items are difficult to complete. FALSE
 - a. There are some very easy items to complete; some are more challenging. Chapters pick and choose what they want to complete.
- 3. The chapter has to earn thousands of points to be recognized. FALSE
 - a. It should be members (or a committee of members) responsible for completing and submitting the criteria.
- 4. Only chapter advisers are permitted to complete the items. FALSE
 - a. To be in the top 10, chapters earned from a high of 900 points to a low of 400 points.
 - b. To be nominated for a Gold Seal chapter, the low number of points was approximately 125.

- ▶ Overall cumulative GPA of at least 3.5 of a 4.0 scale in business, computer, and information technology courses with a minimum of two completed courses.
- ▶ Demonstrated leadership potential through service as a chapter officer, committee leader, or other participation in chapter activities.
- ► Clearly defined career objectives.

Applications may be submitted at any time during the year; however, the final deadline for applications will be March 2, 2018.

New for 2017-18 -- Chapter advisers (not students) may request graduation honor cords from the PA FBLA Executive Director for those schools which will permit honor society recipients to wear them at graduation ceremonies.
