- ⇒ A chapter may enter up to five (5) teams consisting of 1-3 members in the Computer Slide Show Presentation or Web Page Creation events
- ⇒ Top 3 places will be recognized state-wide

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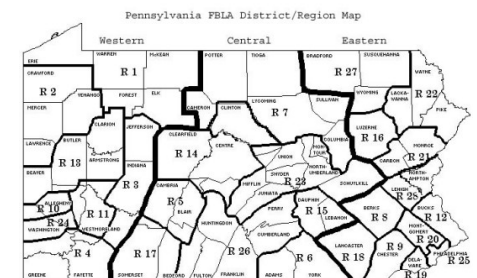

The PA FBLA Middle Level Competitive Events Program

The mission of the National Awards Program is to prepare students for successful careers in business through support for curriculum development and innovative assessment tools. To help meet this charge, the competitive events series has been developed for use in assessing students in the various knowledge, skills and abilities that make up today's business education curriculum. The competitive events program allows members to demonstrate and validate their mastery of essential business concepts, skills and knowledge.

The competitive events program has been correlated to the Business Education Curriculum Standards published by the National Business Education Association and the national career clusters.

In Pennsylvania, middle level competitive events are offered at the state level. Chapters compete in objective testing at either their home-site school during the February testing window, or during their region's RLC (at the discretion of the region adviser). All other events are completed in February at the home-site school and submitted to the state office.

Middle level competitive events are divided into five categories: (1) individual events — both objective and school-site; (2) team events; (3) state only events; (4) chapter events; and (5) recognition events. In order to participate in the events, members must have paid their state and national dues by the dates posted on the PA FBLA website.
