SLC Memories

This year's 2013 State Leadership Conference (SLC) took place from April 15th to 17th at the Hershey Lodge and Convention Center. The conference kicked off with the opening ceremony, where a record number of 4,000 delegates were welcomed to the event. The 2012-2013 State Officer Team led the Opening Session, and candidates for the 2013-2014 State Officer Team delivered their campaign speeches. The session closed with keynote speaker Aric Bostick. Mr. Bostick's humorous & insightful talk inspired and motivated students, teaching them that no matter who they are, they are "awesome." After the session, students and voting delegates were able to view campaign booths, where they could meet officer candidates and ask them questions.

The next day, the competitive events were officially underway. Accounting, Personal Finance, Public Speaking, and Parliamentary Procedure are just a few of the 65 events in which students were given the opportunity to compete. In order to compete at the SLC, students first needed to qualify by competing in their own regions. Then, if they did well enough at the State Leadership Conference, they would be offered the ability to attend the National Leadership Conference (NLC) to be held in Anaheim, California in June.

In addition to competing, students were given the opportunity to learn from business professionals in numerous workshops. These workshops focused on a range of topics from leadership to entrepreneurship. Students could choose to attend whatever workshops they found most interesting, and they were given first-hand advice on how they can become successful in business and in life. These workshops ensured that students always had something to do. If students weren't in the mood for a workshop, though, they had full access to Hershey Lodge's recreational facilities. Mini-golf, a pool, a fitness center, Hershey's Chocolate World, and a nearby shopping center made certain that the SLC was not only an educational experience, but a fun one, too!

After all of the competitive events were over, the conference came to an end with the closing ceremony. For each event, the top ten competitors or teams were announced and given their plaques on stage. Depending on how high they placed, these students also learned whether or not they qualified for NLC. In addition to this, the 2013-2014 State Officer Team was announced. The ceremony closed with some final remarks from our 2012-2013 State President, Emily Wolfe. As usual, this past SLC was a wildly successful event, and all students should strive to attend in 2014!

The Pennsylvania chapter of Future Business Leaders of America has earned its reputation as being one of the most successful state chapters in the nation. One of the main contributions to its success is a successful state project. Every year, the State Officer Team has the pleasure of selecting PA FBLA's state project. This organization and PA FBLA work together to ensure the success of both organizations. In June, the state officers met to choose the state project. Five prospective state projects out of the eighteen submitted were chosen as finalists. These organizations came and made a presentation as to why they should be chosen as this year's state project.

And the PA FBLA's State Project is...

After much discussion and debate, the officers declare **Donate Life Pennsylvania** as the charity for the 2013-2014 PA FBLA state project. Our fundraising goal this year is \$30,000, but of course we would love to go beyond this. With your contributions, fundraisers, and genuine effort, I am confident that PA FBLA members will exceed this amount. There will be a "Great Ways to Fundraise" pamphlet available to you soon to aid in your fundraising efforts. The slogan for this year's partnership is "**Saving Lives 30 Seconds at a Time.**"

What is Donate Life Pennsylvania?

Donate Life Pennsylvania is a nonprofit organization that includes both the Gift of Life Donor Program (GOL) in Eastern Pennsylvania and the Center for Organ & Recovery Education (CORE) in Western Pennsylvania. Both are organ procurement organizations that serve Pennsylvania and constantly work to educate Pennsylvanians. Both try to build awareness about the importance of organ and tissue donation and increase the number of people who sign up to become donors on their driver's license, learner's permit or state identification card.

Why did we pick Donate Life Pennsylvania?

During our June Executive Committee Meeting in Hershey, the State Officer Team was impressed by Donate Life's commitment to educate Pennsylvanians and build awareness of the huge impact of organ and tissue donation. Choosing to be an organ and tissue donor is an important decision. Therefore, the more you learn about it, the more likely it is you will understand why it is so important! Did you know that one organ and tissue donor can save up to 8 lives and heal more than 50 people? These numbers are just astonishing, and with our help, Donate Life will be able to help save even more lives.

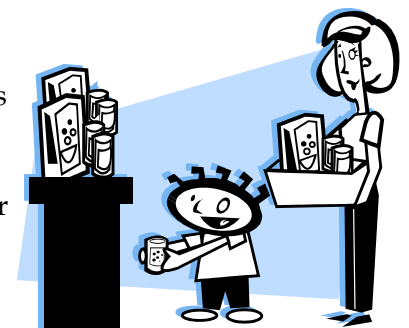


Community service is anything you or a group of people do to benefit the public. This can be something as simple as assisting an individual with her groceries or as complex as organizing a food drive for your local food bank. As a matter of fact, you are probably doing things every day that could count as service hours. Why not get rewarded for what most of you are already doing? Have you heard of **Big 33**? For those of you who have not, Big 33 is an award PA FBLA presents to members who have logged the most community service hours within a given school year. How do you log your hours?

- Go to the PA FBLA website at www.pafbla.org
- Scroll down and click on the Recognition and Awards tab
- Click on the Big 33 link.
- Scroll down and click on the link to download the appropriate Excel Student Reporting form
- Enter the necessary information and submit to your adviser by the due date listed on the form.
- *Forms are submitted to the state office on a quarterly basis.*



Need a little help earning hours? There is always a need for students who are willing to help out; you just need to ask the question, "How can I help?" Local food banks need help on distribution days. Churches have numerous events throughout the year with very few volunteers. Look for needs in your community, and try to fill them. If you really want to make a difference, organize something with your chapter. Your fellow members might need some service hours, too, or maybe they just like to help. You could do any number of things: read to your school's elementary students, plant flowers in public areas, or even visit a nursing home and hand out cards. The opportunities are endless.

CHAPTER SPOTLIGHT

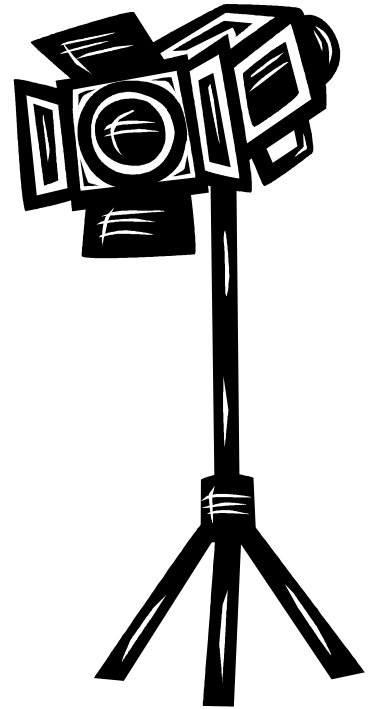
