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SLW Recap

On the weekend of November 10-11, members of Pennsylvania FBLA gathered together in State College to experience "Excellence in Action." Your Executive Committee members met a day earlier to finish planning and organizing the events for the weekend.

The fun began on Sunday morning after registration. Members came together for the Opening Session, where the State Officers conducted the Emblem Ceremony to explain exactly what FBLA is and what it stands for. After this, Shela Wu, your State Treasurer, discussed PA FBLA's goals regarding this year's state project, and she introduced Dwendy Johnson, a representative from Donate Life Pennsylvania. Dwendy provided an overview of Donate Life Pennsylvania's missions and goals, and she outlined ways that we can help reach these goals.

After listening to Dwendy speak, the members welcomed keynote speaker Julie Carrier. Members got to listen to this award-winning author talk about leadership, confidence, and character. She talked about being BeYOUtiful, which went along with a book



she wrote with that same title. Julie was also a workshop presenter. where she further talked to teens about her philosophy and helped them gain more confidence in themselves.

We then heard from Jason Lucash, an entrepreneur who, along with his business partner, launched OrigAudio and appeared on ABC's show, "Shark Tank." Jason was able to take this idea and hold a workshop where FBLA members created their own business pitches, and the top three were

able to present their ideas at the Closing Session on Monday.

For the rest of the day, members attended workshops, participated in the Basket Auction, and competed in the Battle of the Chapters and Dodge Ball competitions. Claysburg-Kimmel FBLA took home the championship for the Battle of the Chapters competition, and Souderton took home first in the Dodge Ball tournament. With these

events, along with the Go Green SLW T-Shirt campaign and other donations, PA FBLA has raised a little over \$6,000!

On Monday, members participated in the final workshops of the weekend and gathered back together for the Closing Session. PA FBLA welcomed Earl Springer, Manager of Employee Programs at Sheetz, to close the session. Earl presented a video about the ways that Sheetz has grown from a company with one small store to a company that has



over 465 stores in 6 states. He then challenged everyone in the audience to answer the interactive questionnaire that went along with the video. After that, he shared what makes Sheetz so successful, and he talked about how to manage large companies. The SLW ended with the annual Basket Auction, and members left with a vast amount of knowledge. Be sure to look for information about the 2014 SLW at the beginning of the upcoming school year!

Teaching the Community About the American Enterprise System

Helping the Food Bank

This year the Chestnut Ridge local Future Business Leader of America chapter has gone to our local Food Bank in New Paris, PA. Each month the food bank distributes food to members of the community who are less fortunate. Members of the chapter travel to the food bank on every third Friday of the month, where the students help to distribute food to the members of the community.

During these trips to the food bank, many of the members of the chapter have realized how fortunate they are to have a meal every day. Austin Miller said, "By coming together as a community we can reach out and help many others that are in need and make a difference in our community for the better." Other members of the chapter have also done a lot by donating food for the New Paris Food Bank during our food drive.

Just recently, the FBLA chapter held a food drive that provided a surplus of food for the food bank. Over the past few months the supply of food has gone down due to budget cuts and the economy of the community. This food drive was held district-wide from kindergarten through twelfth grade. The classrooms competed to see who had the most items. By doing this, it created a lot of competition which created more items for the food bank. We also collected donations at the gates of our Homecoming game, where students dressed up as food cans and other food items. Through this, we raised about two hundred dollars that went to the New Paris Food Bank.

Currently, members are still going to the food bank and donating their time to the community so that less fortunate members can have meals. Both the food bank and Chestnut Ridge FBLA members enjoy spending time with each other and giving to the community. Through the hard work at the food bank the community has fed over two hundred people and restocked their shelves monthly.

The Chestnut Ridge Chapter of FBLA recently held their annual blood


